ACCIDENT / INCIDENT INVESTIGATION

INTRODUCTION

Although we work hard to prevent accidents from happening, if one occurs it can be devastating. We want to investigate every accident because we want to take steps to prevent it from happening again.

Group Discussion:

- Give an example of someone you know who was injured. What happened?
- What affect would it have on you and your family if the injury happened to you?

If you are assigned to investigate an accident or injury, do so thoroughly. If you are interviewed, be honest and answer the questions to the best of your ability.

DETERMINING ROOT CAUSE

To determine root cause we must usually go five layers deep. We call this the "Five Why's".

Example: A worker falls 18' off a roof and lands on his back. He needs surgery and will miss at least six months of work. Thinking about this:

- How would you answer the "Five Why's"?

As we will see, we must DIG to get the answers. Consider these possible answers:

(1) **Why did he fall off the roof?** He lost his footing and the lanyard connected to his harness was too long and he hit the ground.

(2) **Why was the lanyard too long?** Because there was only one anchor on the roof and he was working at the corner of a roof edge.

(3) **Why was there only one anchor?** Because that's all they had on site.

(4) **Why is that all they had on site?** Because no one planned how many anchors would be needed.

(5) **Why was it not factored in?** How would you answer?

INVESTIGATION TIPS AND TOOLS

Interviewing Witnesses: Interview people separately to get unbiased statements. Ask questions until you are able to ascertain the FACTS of the incident and the REASONS they occurred.

Follow up: Place your findings in a report and submit to company management for review. Discern and changes that should be made and implement them.
